Goal

To provide support and access to disadvantaged and underrepresented **Torrance Unified School District** students enabling them to concurrently complete high school and college course work.



What is Early College?

- A Partnership between school districts and two or four year colleges/universities.
- A type of dual enrollment program.
- Provides an opportunity for students to earn an associate's degree or up to two years of college credits toward a bachelor's degree in high school—at no cost to students.



Benefits


Early College students are significantly more likely to enroll in college and earn a college degree.

Early College students enrolled in college by the end of high school








FOUR IN FIVE

Early College students enrolled in college within six years after high school







POSTSECONDARY COMPLETION RATES

Dually Enrolled

Students will be enrolled at NHS and ECC over four years (9th-12th grade) Earning High School Graduation Credits

Earning Transferable College Credits

Earning an AA/AS Degree Students will complete their high school graduation requirements on the North High School Campus.

- Students will complete general education courses that will work with their high school schedule.
- Students may complete courses in their major of study.



Completion of College Credits

Students will take General Education courses from the **IGETC Curriculum**

IGETC

Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum.

This plan is designed primarily for students who intend to transfer to the University of California (UC) or who are undecided between UC and California State University (CSU).

Earn UC Transferable College Units

Students completing the full four-year Early College Program may earn up to **55 transferable credits**; equivalent to two years of college coursework.



After Early College

College Freshman

Students who complete this program may apply to the university as college freshmen & transfer the credits earned from El Camino College. The university may require additional GE courses based on university entrance requirements.

Continue at ECC and then transfer

Students may continue as ECC Students to complete their AA/AS degree and/or transfer requirements. Students who wish to apply as transfer students to the university must attend at least one semester of community college after high school graduation.

IGETC certification applies only to transfer students.



Logistics

- Classes will be predominantly on the NHS campus.
- In 11th and 12th grades, students will take courses on the ECC Campus and the NHS Campus.
- Transportation will be provided for students between the ECC Campus and NHS.
- ECC professors will be teaching the college classes. A class may be taught by a NHS teacher if they meet the minimum qualifications to teach an ECC class and are hired by the college.
- Students will have ultimate flexibility within this program and can participate in extracurricular sports and activities on the NHS campus.



What Will This Cost?



The tuition, fees and cost of textbooks will all be covered.



Potential College Savings

Estimated average costs for California residents, 2020–21

This chart estimates the cost of attending UC for one year as a California resident undergraduate. For a significant proportion of our students, these expenses are offset by grants and scholarships.

Keep in mind that your total cost will vary depending on your personal expenses and the campus you attend.

A student could enter a UC campus with potentially 2 years of college credit.

This could mean saving up to \$73,000 dollars in tuition, room and board at a UC campus!

 Inaugural year course offered O4 for 10 week

- Students develop plan for personal, academic and career success





Application Process

Overview

The application will be completed via a Google Form. There are 3 sections for the student to complete, in addition to a teacher recommendation form.

01

Student Information

Student general and contact information

02

Student Questions & Self-Rating Scale

Student answers questions regarding their learning style and study habits

03

Student Short Response

Students will answer 4 short response questions describing themselves as learners, why they want to participate in the program, and their high school, college/career plans



Application Process (Cont.)

04

English Teacher Reference

Student will notify their current English teacher and request the completion of the Early College Letter of Recommendation via Google Form

05

Student Expectations Contract

Once accepted to the program, the student and their parent/guardian will review and sign-off on the set of program expectations on the Early College Contract
