>> Gifted and Talented Education (GATE)

The Torrance Unified School District recognizes the needs of students with exceptional abilities.

The purpose of the TUSD GATE Program is to:

- identify students with abilities well beyond grade or age expectations
- support their instructional program by establishing how students can receive differentiated learning experiences within the classroom, opportunities for enrichment, and social-emotional support











Differentiated Instruction

Depth, Complexity, Acceleration, & Novelty in the regular classroom



GATE Clustering

Grades 4-5 To support differentiation in the regular classroom



Enrichment

Grades 3-8 Sessions focus on social-emotional needs of gifted learners through critical/creative thinking activities



GATE Conference

Spring event for Grade 3-8 GATE students and parents



Note: GATE identification is not a part of course placement at the secondary level (ex: Accelerated Math, AP, Honors, etc.)

Are easy to raise




Do not have special learning needs

Characteristics of Gifted Learners



Advanced comprehension and a faster pace of learning



A need for **complexity and intensity**



A desire for **depth**



Originality of expression



Ability to **generalize and work comfortably with abstract ideas**



Ability to **synthesize diverse relationships**

TUSD GATE Identification Process 2023-2024

- <u>3rd Grade:</u>
 Universal Screening (Opt-OUT)
 - Universal GATE screening will be administered to all third grade students in the district
 - No form or application for participation in Grade 3 is necessary

- 4th-5th Grade: Parent Permission (Opt-IN)
 - Eligible students for TUSD GATE screening will receive a notice (i.e. new to TUSD or have only screened once before)
 - ◆ Parent/guardian <u>permission is</u> <u>required</u> for participation (by 10/4/23).

>>> TUSD GATE Identification Process 2023-2024

- Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test (NNAT3)
 - ◆ 30-minute nonverbal cognitive assessment (48 problems)
 - Focuses on analytic and problem solving skills rather than specific knowledge
 - ◆ Pictorial directions no spoken or written language required
 - Online using Chromebook
 - Intended to be taken without any preparation
 - Rather than placing pressure on performance and score, please support students and lower testing anxiety by encouraging students to get a good night's rest and to try their best

>>> TUSD GATE Identification Process 2023-2024

- Results & Notification
 - Results and notification of identification will be mailed home after all district screening has been completed & processed (by February 2024)
 - ◆ Intellectual Category: 95 Percentile or above qualifies for GATE identification in TUSD
 - ◆ High-Achievement Category: based on NNAT3 & CAASPP results from 2023-2024 school year (review conducted in summer 2024)
 - Once a student has been identified GATE in TUSD, there is no need for further screening

Screening Schedule & Forms

2023-2024 GATE Screening Schedule

3rd Grade Withdraw form

(only for families that would like to Opt-OUT a student from universal screening)

4th-5th grade Opt-IN permission forms

(emailed directly to eligible students by Testing Office)

Deadline for submission of all GATE screening related forms is October 4, 2023.

>>> TUSD GATE Identification Process 2023-2024

- New to TUSD and GATE in a previous district
 - Please contact <u>nakasuji.heather@tusd.org</u> for a Permission to Request GATE records from previous district for TUSD GATE Office review
 - Because identification criteria and protocol vary greatly among localities, transfer students who have been identified in other school districts may or may not qualify for GATE identification in TUSD.

Discussing GATE screening & results with your child

Some considerations:

- GATE identification is a helpful tool that can show teachers, parents, and students more about how someone learns and some potential social-emotional needs of gifted learners to consider
- GATE identification is not an indicator of a child's ultimate outcome - rather it is an opportunity to determine the best ways to support student success
- A child may be high-performing and extremely capable without being identified as gifted
