Communication "How to Survive Middle School."

- * 3 Year Partnership between: Parent, Student and School.
- * Agenda Book- Parents check it, go over with child!
- Misplaced Items, Forgotten Lunch, students can call from office.
- * Student Advocate Develop Skills
- * Backpack checks/clean out

Communication "How to Survive Middle School."

- * Two easy ways to Communicate with Teachers: call or email for appointment. Be proactive, don't wait for a problem.
- * Meet in person
- * Encourage parents to meet with teachers prior to meeting with Assistant Principal or Principal.
- * For student discipline concerns, contact the Assistant Principal.

Communication "How to Survive Middle School."

- * Friends: Make lots of them!
- Important to monitor, especially new friends
- * -Call other parents, verify activity
- * Late Start Days: Problems at Ralphs/Taco Bell(unstructured free time)-Cafe Open
- * Key: Parent Involvement, Communication, Consistency.
- * Volunteer on campus, not the time to pull back

Personal Property

- * Limit what we bring to school
- * Essential items
- * Wallets: Cash Limits
- Lockers: Do not share locker combos, completely lock it, grouped by grade level.
- * Practice over the summer, opening a combo lock!

*More mature to make the decision, when they are ready. *Some Parents regret early advancement, forces the child into a math pathway, can hurt HS GPA. *Additional stress at the middle school level.

Math Conversations

- * **Rush in Math**, gaps not seen Alg 2, can have potential damage to transcript or repeating the class.
- * 11th Grade State Test: Alg 2 is the highest level tested
- * MS Alg (40weeks), Summer(24weeks), not the class to rush, foundation for all math moving forward.
- * SHS: some 9th graders not successful in Geo, retake Alg in 10th grade.
- * National College Path: 9th Grade takes Algebra.
- * Calc BC: Skip AB if Pre-Calc H good at math.

Math Acceleration Conversation

- * Summer Courses can be taken in High School to Accelerate
- * 6th Grade is not the last chance to advance in math
