ENGLISH

• Read five hours (Summer Book on Website) a week and keep a written journal.

HISTORY:

• Chronology Terms: Decade, Century, Millennium, BC, AD, Chronological

SCIENCE:

Reading and using a ruler.

OTHER:

Be able to open a combo lock, there is a video on the Calle website.

Q: Is there a time to come visit the campus before the first day of school, 26 August?

A: Yes, we have OPEN HOUSE on 30 MAY, 6:000PM, Outdoor Music Concert, 19 MAY, 4:30PM.

Q: Are afterschool clubs open to all students?

A: Yes, all students are welcome to attend any of the afterschool clubs, teachers will announce at the beginning of the school year when the clubs will be meeting. **Donate to the Calle PTSA**, they provide the funding for all of these afterschool clubs.

Q: How does my child attend an Office Hour intervention?

A: Teachers can request a student to attend an Office Hour session. Parents can contact their child's teacher and request that they are seen during an Office Hour session. Students can also request to attend an Office Hour by speaking to their teacher. It is also a good point to review your child's agenda book to check on upcoming tests or due dates for assignments.

Q: How do I know what is happening on an Office Hour?

A: The school will send out a weekly Office Hour Sheet which highlights the essential skills/content that they will be working on during that session. It is a great idea to review this with your child and help them make decisions on which session they should attend. Encourage them to talk to their teacher about challenges that they may be having in a class, student advocacy is an important middle school skill to work on

Q: Are afterschool clubs open to all students?

A: Yes, all students are welcome to attend any of the afterschool clubs, teachers will announce at the beginning of the school year when the clubs will be meeting. **Donate to the Calle PTSA**, they provide the funding for all these afterschool clubs.

Q: If my child is having difficulty in their class, what do I do?

A: Contact that teacher and set up a meeting, teachers are available to meet before/after school and have a conference period everyday. If you are concerned about an assignment that was turned in or are wondering about a grade that they received, set something up with their teacher, being proactive is always the best approach.

Q: If my child has had or was a victim of a behavioral issue (bullied, not nice action) what do I do or who do I contact?

A: If there was an incident in a class, please contact that teacher. If there is something going on during a break (nutrition, lunch, before/after school) please contact the Assistant Principal, Mrs. Leach. Students will need to fill out an Incident Report Sheet, they are available in the Office.
