Torrance is a suburban community of 140,000 in the South Bay area situated below the beautiful Palos Verdes Peninsula on the beach front of southwestern Los Angeles County. It is located 17 miles southwest of Los Angeles Civic Center and 7 miles northwest of Los Angeles Harbor. Torrance boasts a particularly healthy economy, a near perfect weather pattern, two miles of white sand beach, an extensive financial center and a safe secure community. The school community consists of single-family residences, small businesses and apartments.



South High School is a place in which everyone is teaching and everyone is learning. Students and staff are valued and mutually supportive in their efforts to pursue learning. Students are ensured the opportunity to become life-long learners, participants in a democracy, and to lead productive work lives. Adults and students are constantly learning because everyone is involved with the development of everyone else.

MISSION

SOUTH HIGH SCHOOL

South High is one of four comprehensive four-year high schools in the Torrance Unified School District with an enrollment of approximately 1900 students. Our certificated faculty includes 90 teachers, 4 administrators, a site supervisor, 4 counselors, a dean, a college and career counseling coordinator, and a librarian. The pupil-to-teacher ratio is based on 28 to 1. The graduation rate for the class 2022 was 99.6%. Approximately 92.5% of our graduates enter institutions of higher learning. The student activities program sponsors 48 active clubs, including annual drama & dance productions and an Academic Decathlon team, and a full student leadership program under the direction of the Student Activities Advisor. There are 20 varsity sports in boys and girls athletics with a total of 52 athletic teams supported by a full marching band and auxiliary, drill team, & pep squad.



CURRICULUM

Honors classes are offered in English 1, 2, Spanish, Korean, French, Geometry, Algebra 2, Pre-Calculus, Multi-Variable Calculus & Advanced Math, Biology, and Chemistry. Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, Calculus AB & BC, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Science, World History, US History, Economics and Government, Psychology, Statistics, French, Japanese, Spanish, Music Theory, Human Geography, and Computer Science. Approximately 55% of students participate in the Honors/Advanced Placement Program. Accelerated course work is offered to middle school students in Math, Science and Foreign Language. We also offer several Dual Enrollment courses where students get both high school and college credit. Offered courses include English 1A & 1C, Chinese (4 levels), ASL (2 levels), and PLTW Engineering (2 courses). The Southern California Regional Occupational Center (So Cal ROC) is a cooperative venture of six school districts. Students can attend up to three hours a day to receive job skill training. Special Day classes, Resource Specialist and Basic/Life Skills Programs are also offered. A full English Language Development (ELD) program is available for Limited-English speaking students. We also offer a college level Multi-Variable Calculus class designed for students who have completed the Calculus AP course work.

GRADING/CREDIT SYSTEM

Student progress is reported with the following grading system:

- A Excellent—4 grade points
- **B** Above Average—3 grade points
- C Average—2 grade points
- **D** Below Average—1 grade point
- **F** Fail— 0 grad point

Citizenship is reported as follows:

- E Excellent
- **S** Satisfactory
- **U** Unsatisfactory

Credit is given at the rate of 5 credit points for each one-period course completed successfully each semester. A one-period course for two semesters receives 10 credits; a two-period course successfully completed receives 10 credits for one semester and 20 credits to two semesters. The customary course load for a year is 60 credits.

A composite citizenship grade is entered on the transcript each semester and reflects the citizenship grade given by a majority of the student's teachers.

GPA/CLASS RANK

Grade Levels Included:

Transcripts reflect the grades earned by the student from grade 8 through 12 for classes taken at the high school. Senior class rank is calculated at the end of the first semester during the senior year.

Courses Included:

Courses included in the GPA are all those in which grades are given except Physical Education and Athletics.

Rank in Class:

Class rank is based on the student's performance in all courses taken at the high school, including courses taken at the high school in 8th grade, (with the exception of Physical Education and Athletics). All Honors and AP courses are weighted.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A student who fulfills the following requirements shall be eligible for graduation from South High School:

- 1. Satisfactory citizenship as evidenced by six or more semesters of composite satisfactory or composite excellent citizenship.
 - 2. Completion of a minimum of 220 credits detailed below:
- 20 credits in Mathematics
- 20 credits in Science (10 credits in Biological Science and 10 credits in Physical Science) or 20 credits in Integrated Science
- 40 credits in English
- 30 credits in Social Studies (10 credits in World History, 10 credits in US History, 5 credits in US government and 5 credits in Economics)
- 10 credits in Fine Arts or Foreign Language
- 20 credits in Physical Education
- 5 credits in Health
- 75 credits in additional electives

In 2022, 309 South High seniors (60%) were awarded the California Golden State Seal Merit Diploma for high scores on state tests in English Language Arts, Mathematics, History, Social Science & Science.

Advanced Placement Exams

In 2022, 683 South High School students took 1,378 Advanced Placement Exams. Approximately 86% of the scores were passing with a score of 3 or better (scored 1-5). Exams were taken in Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Chinese, Computer Science, Computer Science Principles, Macro-Economics, Micro-Economics, English Literature & Composi-tion, English Language and Composition, Environmental Science, US History, US Government/Politics, Japanese, French, Music Theory, Physics 1, Physics C: Electricity & Magnetism, Physics C: Mechanics, Psychology, Spanish Language, Statistics, Human Geography, and World History.
