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TORRANCE COMMUNITY

Torrance is a suburban community of 144,486 in the South Bay area situated below the beautiful Palos Verdes Peninsula on the beach front of southwestern Los Angeles County. It is located 17 miles southwest of Los Angeles Civic Center and 7 miles northwest of Los Angeles Harbor. Torrance boasts a particularly healthy economy, a near perfect weather pattern, two miles of white sand beach, an extensive financial center and a safe secure community. The school community consists of single-family residences, small business and apartments. Community support for West High has been a long-standing tradition and has assisted West in maintaining an equally long-standing tradition of educational excellence.

WEST HIGH SCHOOL

West High School is a 4-year comprehensive high school with an enrollment of 1,804 9th to 12th grade students with an additional 178 7th & 8th graders attending early morning sessions. The average class size is 30. Class periods meet for 57 minutes daily. Students are expected to take a minimum of six classes and to enroll in A-G required courses. Zero period classes are offered permitting flexibility in starting and ending time of the school day and the option for some students to carry seven classes per semester. Two semesters comprise the academic year. A large number of students attend a summer school program to support or move ahead in their studies. There are 84 certificated faculty, the majority of whom have a master's degree plus 4 counselors, and 1 dean. West High has been designated a California Distinguished School in 1984, 1994, 1999, 2005, 2013 and again in 2019. West High received the CA Exemplary Program in Arts Education School in 2019. West High was named California Gold Ribbon School in 2015. It received the Excellence in Education Award from the United States Department of Education in 1984 and was awarded the National designation of Blue Ribbon School in 1984.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A student who fulfills the following requirements shall be eligible for graduation from West High School:

1. Satisfactory citizenship as evidenced by six or more semesters of composite satisfactory or composite excellent citizenship.
2. Completion of a minimum of 220 credits detailed below:
 - 20 credits in Mathematics
 - 20 credits in Science (10 credits in Biological Science and 10 credits in Physical Science)
 - 40 credits in English
 - 30 credits in Social Studies (10 credits in World History, 10 credits in US History, 5 credits in US government and 5 credits in Economics)
 - 10 credits in Visual or Performing Arts/Foreign Language
 - 20 credits in Physical Education
 - 5 credits in Health
 - 75 unspecified elective courses



COLLEGE ATTENDANCE

In the past several years West High School graduates have been admitted to a variety of colleges and universities, among them: Arizona State University, Art Center College of Design, Biola University, Brigham Young University, California State Polytechnic University-Pomona, El Comino College, Long Beach City College, San Luis Obispo; California State University-Channel Islands, Dominguez Hills, Fullerton, Long Beach, Monterey Bay, Northridge, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Marcos, University of California - Berkeley, Davis, Irvine, Los Angeles, Riverside, San Diego, Santa Barbara, Santa Cruz; Claremont McKenna College, Clemson University, Columbia College Chicago, Concordia University-Irvine, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, Emory University, Grand Canyon University, Howard University, Otis College of Art and Design, Pepperdine University, Seton Hall University, Texas Christian University, Vanguard University, Washington State University, as well as many others including the Marine, Army, Navy and Air Force programs.



CURRICULUM

A wide variety of classes are offered in academic, vocational, and fine arts areas to meet the needs of all students. West High teachers have transitioned to Common Core State Standards (CCSS) and Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) as adopted by the State of California. In addition, English, as a Second Language and “sheltered” academic classes are available for English Language Learner Students. Special Day classes and a Resource Specialist Program are available for Special Education students. Honors and/or Advanced Placement classes are scheduled in all academic areas.

Advanced Placement courses: Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science Principles, English Language, English Literature, US Government, & Politics, Human Geography, Japanese Language, Macroeconomics, Physics, Psychology, Spanish Language, Statistics, Studio Art, US History, World History.

Honors courses: Algebra 2, Anatomy/Physiology, Biology, Chemistry, English 1 & 2, French 3, Geometry, Korean 4 & 5, Pre-Calculus, and Spanish 2 & 3.

GRADING/CREDIT SYSTEM

Student progress is reported with the following grading system:

- A** Excellent—4 grade points
- B** Above Average—3 grade points
- C** Average—2 grade points
- D** Below Average—1 grade point

Citizenship is reported as :

- E** Excellent
- S** Satisfactory
- U** Unsatisfactory

Credit is given at the rate of 5 credit points for each one-period course completed successfully each semester. A one-period course for two semesters receives 10 credits. The customary course load for a year is 60 credits.

A composite citizenship grade is entered on the transcript each semester and reflects the citizenship grade given by a majority of the student's teachers.

GRAD LEVELS INCLUDED

Transcripts reflect the grades earned by the student from grade 7 through 12 for classes taken at the high school.

COURSES INCLUDED

Courses included in the GPA are all those in which grades are given except Physical Education and Athletics. All Honors and AP courses are weighted.

RANK IN CLASS

Class rank is based upon weighted GPA. Senior class rank is calculated following the 7th semester of coursework.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS

In 2022-23, **1,147** Advanced Placement Exams were taken by **552** West High students.

Approximately **88%** of the scores were 3 or better (scored 1-5), and the mean average for all exams was 3.83 (out of 5). The exams taken included Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Chinese Language & Composition, Computer Science Principles, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, Human Geography, US Government & Politics, Japanese Language & Culture, Macroeconomics, Physics 1 & 2, Psychology, Spanish Language & Culture, Statistics, Studio Art Drawing, US History, & World History.

SAT SUBJECT TESTS

STATE & FEDERAL ACCOUNTABILITY

STATE ACCOUNTABILITY

The State Accountability measurement transitioned from API to the CA Dashboard in early 2018. The Dashboard includes the school's population and measurements of: CAASPP (Math, ELA and coming in the future the Science CAST exam), College & Career Index (CCI), A-G, Grad Rate, Attendance, English Language Learner Development and Suspension Rate.

FEDERAL ACCOUNTABILITY

The Federal Accountability Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP): Per No Child Left Behind Act has been suspended and currently districts and schools are using the CA Dashboard: Previously under AYP, West High met all 9 AYP criteria in all areas with all significant subgroups for 2016. 2017.





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West High Profile Addendum for 2020-2021

COVID-19 Impacts on the 2019-2020 Torrance Unified School District Grading Procedures

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, California's Governor closed all schools on March 13, 2020, and they remained closed for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year. TUSD began Distance Learning after March 13, and made the following changes to our schedules and grading practices:

- 1) Letter grade scale limited to A, B, C, D
- 2) Students who received a "B" or a "C" had the opportunity to elect to change their letter grade to a "P" indicating "pass" with credit earned. "P's" are not included in GPA calculations.
- 3) "I" grades were issued for students who did not meet the standard of a "D" or better for 2nd semester. Students who received an "I" grade were placed on a contract to complete the course. Completing the contract will result in changing the "I" grade to a "P" indicating a "pass" and credit will be issued. Students who do not fulfill their contract may be issued an "F" grade. Students have until January 2021 to fulfill their contract.

West High Profile Addendum for 2021-2022

AB 104 on the 2020-2021 Torrance Unified School District Grading Procedures

GRADE CHANGES (Pass/No Pass)

Education Code section 49066.5 (AB 104) establishes that a parent, which includes the natural or adoptive parent or guardian, the person having legal custody, or other educational rights holder, or a student who is age 18 or older and enrolled in high school during the 2020-21 school year, **may apply for one or more of their child's letter grades for a course, taken during the 2020-21 school year in high school**, to be changed to a Pass or No Pass on the student's transcript. There is no limit as to the number or type of courses eligible for this grade change application. The grade change application shall not negatively affect the student's grade point average or result in the forfeiture of a student's eligibility for athletics or school programs.

The grade change application must be made prior to October 1, 2021. A school will not accept applications after that date. The school is required to make the change of a student's grade from a letter grade to a Pass (A-D) or No Pass (F) within 15 days of the request and will notify the student and student's parent or guardian that the grade was changed.

Absent an application to change a transcript by this date, a letter grade earned in the 2020-21 school year will remain on the student's transcript. Please note some postsecondary educational institutions, including those in other states, may not accept a Pass or No Pass grade instead of a letter grade for admission purposes.
